The funds will be used to pay for the much-needed tactical safety vests for the Police Department's SWAT Team, their newest team member "Nala" for the Department's canine program, memorabilia commemorating the Department's fallen officers, and a mobile vehicle for the City's Disaster Response Team.

City Emergency Response Program

The Foundation continued to support the City's Emergency Response Program with the purchase of an All-Terrain Vehicle that will to be used in tandem with the trailer also purchased by the Foundation. These vehicles are intended to serve the community as a mobile command center for the City's disaster response volunteers, and will contain a variety of equipment and tools to be utilized by these individuals in the event of a major emergency or disaster in the area. In addition, the trailer will also be utilized for training and recruitment purposes. Typical equipment to be maintained and transported within trailer include triage, communication and safety equipment, first aid supplies, hand tools, canopies and a portable generator.
