




Spooktacular 5K Run/Walk

That we can have school vs. school, business vs. business and continue to fundraise not just for a singular project but for in this show. Dancing itself the betterment of the Whittier community for years to come.

I practiced a lot because I had no dance experience and I knew my dance was challenging. This experience has been incredible and one I will never forget. If anyone is thinking about participating and want to talk, please reach out to me. I didn't have dance experience, but I had the desire to practice and to honor my late husband.
